12. WWI COMMEMORATION - HANDCRAFTED STEEL POPPIES

To mark the centenary of the First World War, blacksmiths and farriers from around the world are handcrafting steel poppies for a cenotaph to be erected in the Flanders area of Belgium. A number of the poppies will be available to purchase at a cost of £30 per poppy. It has been suggested that 46 of these poppies are acquired by the town to honour the 46 residents who died during the First World War, and whose names are listed on the War Memorial.

The Royal British Legion are discussing the possibility of underwriting the cost of 23 of the poppies at a cost of £690, and have approached the Town Council to gauge interest in the possible underwriting of the remaining 23. Gary Kendall of the Royal British Legion will be in attendance at the meeting to answer any questions.

A report giving further details of the project alongside suggestions for Royal Wootton Bassett's involvement is attached, *Appendix B*.
